Why Contract?

- Can desired outcomes be integrated into contract language?
- Who is responsible for contract...
 - Development,
 - Implementation, and
 - Monitoring?
- Are expectations...
 - Fair & Reasonable?
 - Enforceable?
 - Negotiable?
 - Conflicting?


